Forbidden items

A number of items are banned from Newland School for Girls this is for reasons of **security, safety** or the orderly conduct of the school.

- Aerosol sprays
- Chewing gum
- Cigarettes, matches and lighters
- Drinks in glass bottles
- Large marker pens or indelible markers
- Acrylic / False Nails

My appearance:

- I will only wear one pair of studs/sleepers
- I will not wear any facial piercings/including tongue piercings
- I will not have any extreme hair colour/style
- I will not wear long false/acrylic nails
- I will only wear discreet make up

Mobile Phones

We understand that mobile phones are a means of security for girls on their way to and from school, however during the school day they should be neither seen or heard when the girls are in any of the buildings.

- Phones may be used in the outside areas during break and lunchtime only.



SAFETY

- It is not unusual for teenagers to experience some relationship problems and to 'fall out' with their friends. Resolving this is all part of growing up.
- The school implements Restorative Practice to resolve situations and ensure that students take responsibility and learn from their actions.
- Any issues regarding personal safety, feelings and emotions, bullying, please encourage your daughter to speak with Mrs Iverson, or myself.

Social Media

The school increasingly deals with issues due to misuse of Social media

- **Prevention** – restrict use, age appropriate apps, talk to your child about appropriate use and consequences.
- **Action** - block, report and remove app. Issues will stop if the device is not being used inappropriately.
- **Police involvement** - encouraged where a crime has potentially taken place - slander, abuse, threats.
- **Monitor and review usage**




Attendance

Target – 100% attendance

- No school time holidays (£60 fine per parent)
- Appointments outside of school hours or in holidays
- 10 day persistent absence leads to prosecution

Punctuality

- Lesson start at 8.45am.
- We expect your daughter to arrive at school **no later than 8.40.**
- The gates are locked at 8.40am and your daughter will receive a lunch time detention if arriving after the 8.45am bell.
- After school detention for persistent lateness



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N\$G reward points

- **Good work** – that I have completed an excellent piece of work, or I have been successful completing a new task. I have contributed significantly in lessons, or I have been an effective leader. (5 Points)
- **Homework** – I have completed an outstanding piece of Homework. (5 Points)
- **House Awards** – I won a House Challenge competition, or made a significant contribution to my House. (25 Points)
- **Student Leadership** – I have taken responsibility for an area of leadership within the school, or I have demonstrated outstanding leadership skills in or out of lessons. (10 Points)
- **SMSC Award** – I have been nominated for a SMSC Star Award for my significant contribution towards the school or community. (15 Points)
- **Headteachers commendation** - I could be nominated for reward this by my teacher. (25 Points)
